

Drone Permit

Please visit the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) website: <https://www.faa.gov/uas/>, the operators would be under Part 107. Along the beach in Atlantic City if you're below 1,300' you're technically in Class G airspace and outside of the Class C airspace, a waiver nor airspace authorization is needed unless you are flying above 400' AGL. It can fly 400' above the casinos but then it would be in Class C airspace and would require an airspace authorization from ACY. However, there is a lot of helicopter and fixed-wing traffic traversing the beach area so please have your operators contact Atlantic City Tower/Approach Control by phone before commencing operations and monitor approach control on a handheld radio. If operating within 5 miles of an airport or a heliport (AtlanticCare, Golden Nugget, Coast Guard, Shore Memorial, Steel Pier, Hard Rock, etc.), it is good practice to have the operator contact the heliports prior to flight to notify them of their operation, but there is no authorization required (See section 5.8.1 of AC 107-2). They will, however, need to give way and stay well clear of other traffic.

Operations over people and property are not allowed without a waiver, in which case they will be allowed if a waiver request is submitted and approved.
